STALMINE-WITH-STAYNALL PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council held on Tuesday 13 October 2020 at 7.00pm via Zoom video conference.

53(1) Apologies for absence

None.

54(2) Declaration of interests and dispensations

Cllr Williams; Cllr Pelham, application 20/00861/FUL.

55(3) Minutes of the last meeting

Councillors **resolved** to approve as a correct record the minutes of the meetings held on 8 September and 19 September 2020.

56(4) Public participation

Resolved to close the meeting to allow members of the public to speak.

Councillors were asked to note the planning appeal decision for Torbant Lodge and the comments made.

Councillors were asked whether any action was being taken regarding the destruction of the grass verge to the western part of Brickhouse Lane – the clerk to write to LCC for confirmation of actions.

A query was raised regarding the creation of passing places on Wardley's Lane and whether they would be removed once the works around the marina are completed – normally the contractor has a responsibility to reinstate the verge. **Resolved** to reopen the meeting.

57(5) Planning

Application number: 20/00773/FULMAJ

Proposal: Erection of 84 dwellings, car parking, landscaping and all other associated works

Location: Land east of Carr End Lane, Stalmine

Resolved: That the council objects to this application as the additional number of properties now proposed is disproportionate to the application for which permission was granted. This is likely to have a significant and adverse effect on the volume of traffic on Carr End Lane and on the ability of the drainage system to cope with the pressure of an additional 19 properties. The paperwork states 'no groundwater flood risk has been identified' - confirmation of when and how this statement was arrived at needs to be provided. Councillors were also concerned at the amount of grey water being created and the need in these environmentally conscious times to arrange for its re-use. In order to cope with the burden placed on the community were this application to be approved, the council is of the opinion that Carr End Lane would need to be widened by at least 3m to ensure the safety of road users.

Application number: 20/00784/FUL

Proposal: Erection of new equine building to provide additional 8 stables and

youngstock pen for use in association with existing commercial equine business. **Location:** Greygates, 11 Back Lane, Stalmine, Poulton-Le-Fylde, Lancashire.

Resolved: that the council has no objections to the proposal.

Application number: 20/00848/FUL

Proposal: Replacement roof to existing garage. **Location:** West Dene, 3 Carr End Lane, Stalmine-with-Staynall, Poulton-Le-Fylde, Lancashire.

Resolved: that the council has no objections to the proposal.

Cllr Williams and Cllr Pelham stood down from the meeting. **Application number: 20/00861/FUL Proposal:** Change of use of land to equestrian and erection of a stable block for private use.

Location: The Hayloft, Brick House Lane, Hambleton, Poulton-Le-Fylde, Lancashire

Resolved: that the council has no objections to the proposal. It also suggested that a condition be attached that this should be for private use only in association with the dwelling house. It would also like to ask that the clause suggested by Lancashire County Council highways – that the development be for private and commercial use – is not followed as it doesn't follow the planning application.

Cllr Williams and Cllr Pelham re-entered the meeting.

Flower bed near Cold Row

Work commitments have prevented the sponsor – Little Simpsons Tea Rooms – undertaking the planting work. The sponsor has indicated it is still prepared to sponsor the plants for the bed.
